
DPAA News

GOSPEL MEDITATION DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Tickets booked, packing list double -checked, itinerary set - how do you know you're prepared for a trip?
Being ready requires plenty of practical preparation. Do we give the same care to our spiritual preparedness? "Your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom," Jesus tells us. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus reminds us to have the right attitude for the gifts and callings he wants to give us!



Clear out your clutter! "Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." Jesus reminds the disciples that earthly standards of security and success will wear out in time. If our lives are structured around values that don't align with the kingdom of God, we'll miss opportunities to receive God. If we're so concerned with our child's success in sports that we miss Sunday Mass for their tournaments, we're missing out receiving the sacraments and building a consistent community of faith. If our quest for the promotion takes us away from family commitments, we won't be able to fully receive the love intended in our closest relationships.

Set faith-based priorities. "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival." Our conflicting commitments can cause any routine to slip from time to time. All the more reason to make sure faith is a priority. Pray as a family before meals. Bring your children regularly to the sacrament of confession. Make room in the schedule for faith enrichment activities offered by your parish. Volunteer once a month. "At an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." When will the call come to care for an ailing parent? To take on a new leadership position? God speaks to us through the circumstances of our lives. He calls each of us to greater love, sometimes in very concrete ways. This week, take some time to consider: Will you be ready?

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

We are asked to be vigilant until our Master returns. Even though our faith tells us that Christ will come again and that our purpose and destiny is an eternal one, it is hard not to lose heart, grow weary, and become distracted. Remembering the stories of our faith and what God has done throughout history is one way of remaining fresh and focused. Celebrating, recalling, and making real and tangible again what God has done is what our community does liturgically each time we gather. As the author of Hebrews reminds us: Faith makes real what we hope for and is the evidence of things we cannot see. Let us take this time once again to remember and participate in what God has done and continues to do.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Plan Wisely

What would happen if you found out right now that relatives of yours were coming into town tomorrow, and they hoped to stay with you? You can either tell them they can't stay with you, or you immediately begin a process of furiously cleaning, straightening up, and grocery shopping in anticipation of your guests. If you don't have to do anything to prepare because your home is perfect, clean, and fully stocked, perhaps you don't live in your home or you are obsessive compulsive. I suspect most people reading this would go into panic mode!

We spend much time putting off things until later. Then when something unexpected happens, we swing into action to deal with it or prepare for its effects. We would have acted differently if we knew what was coming down

the road.

What does your stewardship way of life look like? Are you living as if you have forever, or are you living as if Jesus could return any moment and your life here on earth could end tomorrow? The gift of time is often taken for granted. If we live more mindfully of that gift, we waste less of it and maximize the moments in which we find ourselves. We give of ourselves in ways that are more meaningful and productive. The gift of tomorrow is not promised to you, but the gift of today has already been given. Use this day wisely because who knows what tomorrow may bring.

First Reading

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: I'd like to pray each day, but I can't seem to find the time. Do you have any suggestions?

Answer: There are a lot of different ways to incorporate prayer into your daily routine. Start small by setting aside 10 or 15 minutes at natural breaks in your day, like first thing in the morning, during your lunch hour or a child's nap time, or as the evening winds down just after you've brushed your teeth. Put your phone on do not disturb or in airplane mode and set a timer. That way, you won't be interrupted by others calling or texting - or by yourself checking the time! Pick a place to pray, and sit in the same spot every day. The routine of place can help with focus.

Start with something simple. Scripture is a great start. Pray a single psalm slowly and consider how it relates to your life. Look up the daily Mass Gospel reading on your phone and take the same approach. Take some time to pray for others. Tick off five intentions on your hand each day, or assign each day of the week to a specific person or area of need (i.e., on Mondays, remember the poor, on Tuesdays, pray for your parish, Wednesdays, your extended family). Remember to share honestly with God. Don't be afraid to speak to Him in your heart as you would a friend out loud. Love grows in real relationship.

Celebrating St. Jane Frances de Chantal


Sometimes life isn't about the path we take, but what we make of it. St. Jane Frances de Chantal's life was anything but predictable. Jane was married young to a husband in deep debt. She took charge of the estate, bringing the finances under control with enough to offer generously to those in need. When Jane was 28, her husband was killed in a hunting accident, leaving her the sole caretaker of their four young children. A sermon by her local bishop, St. Francis de Sales, led her to forgive the man responsible for her husband's death. Jane had a special concern for those affected by the unexpected. In 1610, Francis helped Jane found the Visitation Order of religious sisters, which became involved in active ministry to the sick and poor and in accepting women who had been rejected by other religious orders due to age or health. St. Frances de Chantal, pray for us!

The Pilgrimage and Apparition

This past August many parishioners and visiting pilgrims came to St. Patrick Parish and Shrine to seek the intercession of Our Lady of Knock, the Blessed Virgin Mary. We pray to her because, as a shrine, our devotion is to our Lady of Knock, who was so titled during and apparition in Knock, Ireland in 1879.

"The Story of Knock began on the 21st August, 1879 when, at approximately 8 O' clock in the evening, fifteen people from the village of Knock in Co. Mayo, witnessed an Apparition of Our Lady, St. Joseph, St. John the Evangelist, a Lamb and cross on an altar at the gable wall of the Parish Church.

The witnesses watched the Apparition in the pouring rain for two hours, reciting the Rosary. Although they themselves were saturated not a single drop of rain fell on the gable or vision. us, she has let us in and she shows us her There were fifteen official witnesses to the Apparition, most of whom were from the village of Knock and surrounding areas and ranged in age from just 5 years old to 74 years old. Each of the witnesses gave testimonies to a Commission of Enquiry in October 1879. The findings of the Commission were that the testimonies were both trustworthy and satisfactory."

What is a novena anyway?

A novena is a vocal prayer that you commit to praying over an extended period of time, typically nine days. These prayers are usually linked to a specific devotion and typically to a specific intention that we are praying for. One can offer a novena, as a way to petition God for a special grace, like the healing of a sick person or the conversion of someone who is far away from God. It is important to remember, however, that novenas are not magic formulas. They are prayers and are a way we

can enter into conversation with God.

Why do pray the novena?

The Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, and St. John the Evangelist, along with a Lamb atop the altar, appeared one night to a small group of people at the south gable of the Church of St. John the Baptist in County Mayo Ireland, on August 21, 1879.

At the time, this apparition was a certain sign of God's love to a people in need. Pilgrims now travel to the Knock Shrine in Ireland, as Mary in all her motherly love, reaches out to them as Pope Francis said during his trip to Aparacida, "Dear Friends, we have come to knock at the door of Mary's house. She has opened it for Son. Now she asks us to "do whatever he tells you" (Jn 2:5). Yes, dear Mother, we are committed to doing whatever Jesus tells us! And we will do it with hope, trusting in God's surprises and full of joy!'

This was repeated by Archbishop Eamon Martin, of the Archdiocese of Tuam Ireland during the homily at the annual novena Mass at Our Lady's Basilica of Our Lady of Knock in Co Mayo Ireland, which was followed by the Consecration of Ireland to Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, as reported via email in the WorldPriest newsletter, September 3, 2013.

The Archbishop tells us in that homily, "Mary's last recorded words in the scriptures are 'Do whatever he tells you.' Do not be surprised, then, at the beginning of this Novena in Knock, if you hear God calling you today to do something significant and special for Him something that will make a real difference to your life and in the lives of others. Do not be afraid!"



Why Pray the Novena

Our Shrine's devotion is to Our Lady of Knock, whose feast Day is August 22; and so, we pray this novena 9 days prior to this day

If you are hearing a knocking on your heart that just keeps coming back like a though or an urge to come join us, pray with Mary and adore her Son in the Blessed Sacrament, then most likely the Holy Spirit is knocking on your heart repeating what Jesus said, "I will draw all back to myself." Listen to the whispers on your heart the Lord is speaking to you....come join us this next summer, August, 2016 as we again present our prayers and petitions to Our Lady of Knock.
