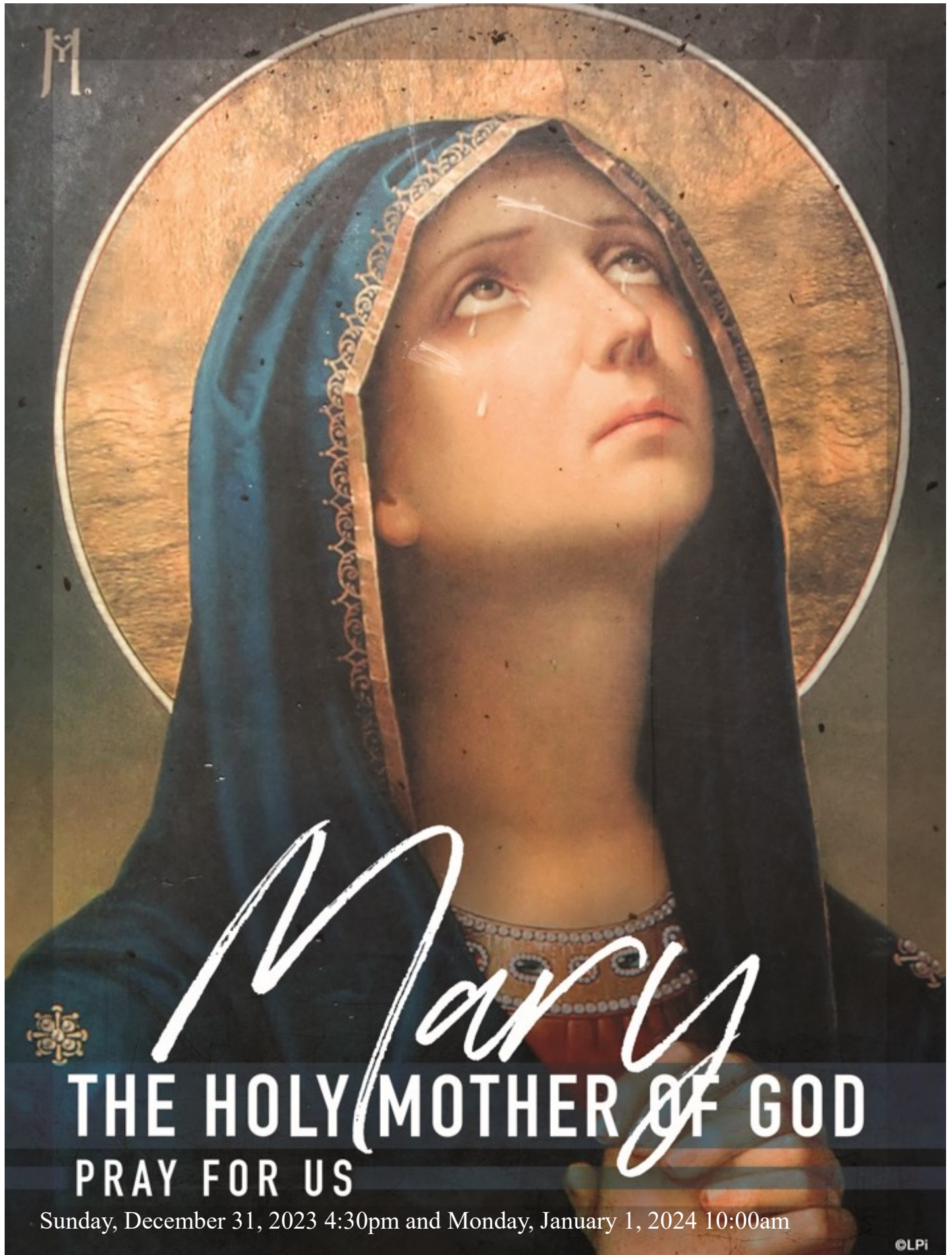

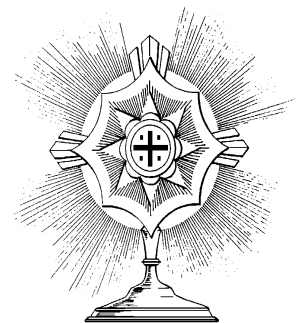

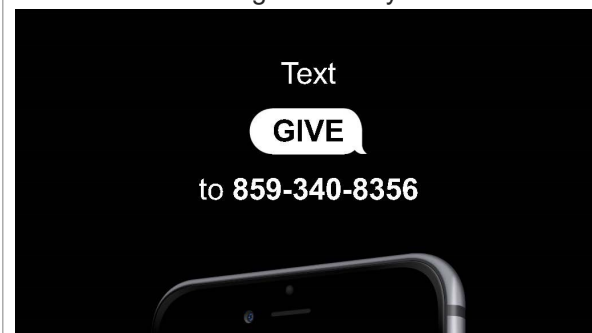

Eucharistic Miracles: Viewpoint by Fr. Jeff VonLehmen

I feel a little bit like Indiana Jones these days in the movie the Last Crusade or Raiders of the Lost Ark. Both are surrounded with the intrigue of the Mystery of Real Presence: the Ark of the Covenant in the Hebrew Scriptures upon which blood of the sacrificial animal was sprinkled. Or how about the Mysterious Chalice used at the Last Supper by Jesus Himself who changed the wine into His Blood and promises Eternal life. Seems like Indiana Jones was drawn into a holy adventure that he did not choose either to fight the Nazi's or rescue his dad. He ended up having no doubt about the Power of the Ark and the Chalice.

So on Sept 8, 2023 , I was present at the reported Eucharistic Miracle . There were a certain number of people who innocently decided to publicize the matter on social media . Of course the valid question then arose: Did Divinized Blood really manifest itself on a Host during a legitimate Mass ?

It is important to use the word "Divinized "because we are not talking about cannibalism. We are speaking of Consecrated Transformed Crucified/Risen Presence capable of leaving its Mark. And It is important to note that everything happened on a Consecrated Host and not before. If a manifestation takes place during Consecration, it cannot be demonic activity.

Thus, I myself was drawn into the search for the truth to discover what I saw and to rescue it from the misinformation on social media .

But what can the Church actually say at a moment like this?

Unlike the movies, this is real life. . Unlike the social media, there are facts that cannot be known through facebook . Why ? Because the "host" is actually being investigated by legitimate Church authorities. Yes, there is an investigation with proper canonical procedure/permissions outside the area .That means those involved reserve testimony for the authorities . The article in the Enquirer “ Can blotch on wafer be a miracle “ 12/2423 completely overlooked that possibility. Information is reserved for good reason. The authorities need time and distance without distractions to objectively discern whether it was simply a personal spiritual experience, some moldy blotch on the host or if there is enough evidence to declare it an authentic Eucharistic miracle (in youth language, an authentic Divine Tattoo.) The article also failed to distinguish between a private and public revelation/manifestation which I mentioned in my written statement. In the end, even if a formal investigation may declare it authentic like the miracle at Luciano , it remains a private manifestation. No one is required to believe it. Thus it remains a matter of personal discernment for everyone. And the Enquire article did not mention the invitation in my written statement to those sincere seekers to take this matter before the Lord in Adoration for personal discernment. We have everything we need right there.

But one more thing I said in the written statement not mentioned in the Enquirer was what I felt has been the purpose of what I witnessed and continue to ponder. That not only is there a Eucharistic Miracle at every Consecration, but that we become the Miracle. St. Augustine said this well upon the reception of the Eucharist: "May we become what we receive".

To further explain, we know certain Eucharistic manifestations happen in the history of the Church for different reasons. This particular reported "private" miracle had nothing to do with unbelieving priests who needed "proof" of Transubstantiation or a stage to prove it. Probably, at least in my mind, that's why it happened at a legitimate private Mass and at a private event to celebrate the Birthday of Mother Mary (not a first communion of a little boy mentioned on facebook).

In my opinion, the purpose of this alleged private miracle has been to emphasize Divine Peace. The event happened just shortly before the Israeli /Palestinian War(prophetic?) and in the midst of the ongoing Ukrainian Russian war (not to mention all the wars in the human heart). Ironically, the sacrificial "blood" in the Scriptures represents life not death and is a remedy for violence. We always note that Holy Sacrifice is not the same as appeasement. The sacrifice associated with the Ark of the Covenant or Chalice at the Last Supper was not meant to appease an angry god, but to bring shalom, that is well being or peace. It is a way of saying that Divine Peace like life itself only God can give.

So no matter how far the formal inquiry will go or whether or not there will be a scientific test, I stated this much: the significance of the Sept 8 event in my humble view is to reinforce St Augustine Eucharistic motto: "Become what you receive" or "Be the miracle". Then we can spread Divine Peace.

Finally, to quote one bishop: "If the Host itself can be confirmed as a Eucharistic miracle, praise God." But that will always remain a personal response for each individual to discern in faith. Returning to the movies, even Indiana Jones experienced the miracle of peace and reconciliation between him and his dad around the Chalice of Eternal life and became a believer in its Power to leave its Mark. Can you and I?

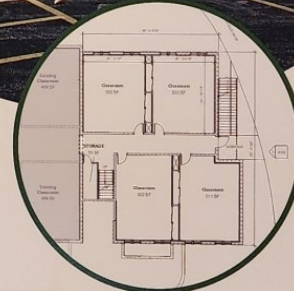
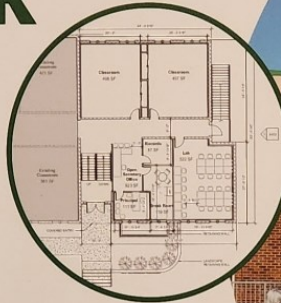

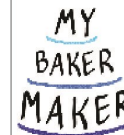
