THE NEW EVANGELIZATION

The new evangelization depends largely on the Domestic Church (cf. [Familiaris Consortio], n. 65). In our time... the eclipse of God, the spread of ideologies contrary to the family and the degradation of sexual ethics are connected. And just as the eclipse of God and the crisis of the family are linked, so the new evangelization is inseparable from the Christian family. The family is indeed the way of the Church because it is the "human space" of our encounter with Christ.²

"The family is also the primary place for evangelization, for passing on the faith, for helping young people to appreciate the importance of religious practice and Sunday observance.

EVANGELIZATION BENEFITS ALL AND GIVES GLORY TO GOD

Small acts of love as well as larger acts are all considered evangelization to others when they witness this. We hope to highlight weekly, some of these evangelistic moments that parishioners at St. Pat's have experienced. The actual quotes used in the bulletin have been summarized.

“I am retired but I stay very busy. I help in my son's business which allows me to be around many young people between the ages of 18 and 25. I speak to them often and try to guide them in their life, helping them with their own path. While speaking with them, I often work in the amazing power of prayer and I'm surprised at the good reaction they give me from that. I often speak to my wife and my children and grandchildren about God, the power of prayer and the importance of leading a good Christian life and being a good person. Sadly, I don't physically do anything in the parish however I often speak to fellow Catholics about how wonderful St. Pat's is.”

“T

here are various ways that I have the opportunity to evangelize as a wife, mother, grandmother, friend and part time employee. I have the unique opportunity to evangelize while working. Customers come during very exciting times in their lives, very painful times in their lives and everywhere in between. Starting conversations with customers offers many opportunities to talk about faith and meet them where they are. Some customers are searching for a connection to God and don't know where to begin. I love the opportunities I get to share my own faith experience and encourage others in their search. My friends are in different places and stages in life. We all experience times when our faith is shaken. Encouraging one another during these challenging times strengthens us all. I belong to a women's prayer group with women who have a variety of experiences with the Catholic faith. This group provides many opportunities for discussions on a variety of Catholic based topics and general faith experiences. At home, my husband and I take every opportunity we can to talk to our adult children about the importance of having God at the center of our lives and the difference faith has had in our lives. We are sure to pray every day and to include God in our conversations. As grandparents, we enjoy recognizing God moments with our grandchildren and reminding them of all that God does for us each day. We have religious artwork on display in our home which makes for opportunities for any visitors to see and give our witness. Some of our children are dating people who are not Catholic. This has given us chances to have conversations with them about our faith and are we are always willing to answer any questions they may have. Evangelization opportunities seem to be all around. It leaves me with such a wonderful feeling to be able to be confident enough in my knowledge of the faith to be able to engage with people. But this confidence was not always there. The more I learned about and understood why the Church teaches what it does, the more willing I was to share my faith. Today, it is always satisfying to me to evangelize.”

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Feb. 1, 2026, 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Matthew 5:1-12a

A priest I know was once falsely accused of a terrible crime. The claim was wild and easily disproved, but for a while, it didn't matter. In the atmosphere shaped by the abuse crisis of the early 2000s, the public assumption was guilty until proven innocent. His name was dragged through the mud, and his ministry placed on hold. I had the privilege — and the burden — of walking closely with him during that time.

He was angry. He was confused. He felt abandoned and deeply disoriented. The last thing on his mind was the words of Jesus in today's Gospel: "Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me ... Rejoice and be glad" (Matthew 5:11-12). Rejoice? He felt anything but.


And yet... something holy slowly grew in him. Not overnight, and not without pain. But as the truth came to light and his name was cleared, I watched him become more Christlike — more patient, more compassionate, more detached from human approval.

Maybe you haven't faced something so dramatic. But where do you feel judged? Misrepresented? Overlooked? Maybe someone else got the credit or the promotion. Maybe someone you love isn't getting their due. In those moments, the Cross of Jesus is near. When we feel accused, that's when we ask him for the grace not just to endure, but somehow, mysteriously, to rejoice and be glad.

HOLY CROSS HIGH SCHOOL LAUNCHES RIVER CITIES SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Holy Cross District High School has launched the River Cities Scholars Program, a new educational initiative supported by a \$2 million challenge grant from the Butler Foundation. The program is designed to expand access to Catholic education for students from Northern Kentucky's river cities while strengthening enrollment and community impact.

Through the challenge grant, Holy Cross will raise another \$2 million in matching funds and anticipates increasing enrollment in grades 9-12 by at least 50 students from Covington, Ludlow, Newport, Bellevue and Dayton, Kentucky over the next four years.

The River Cities Scholars Program will provide significant tuition assistance and academic opportunity to eligible students who reside in one of the five river cities and demonstrate financial need, desire to achieve, academic promise, leadership potential, and commitment to personal growth and community service. Selected students will receive coverage for up to two-thirds of their tuition for four years. Scholars may also apply for additional Holy Cross scholarships and will benefit from a comprehensive support system focused on academic excellence, leadership development and character formation.

The River Cities Scholars Program will begin in the 2026-27 academic year and reflects Holy Cross High School's mission to educate the whole person - mind, body and spirit - while investing in the long-term vitality of the region.

Holy Cross invites alumni, community members and philanthropic partners to support the River Cities Scholars Program. Contributions designated to the initiative will advance the school toward its \$2 million matching goal and help ensure the program's long-term success.
